The last time I saw Ralph was at Chief Horton Walker's funeral in Norfolk. He was sporting a white beard and with his size, he looked just like Papa Smurf. I teased him about it and we shared a good laugh.

I know that he served with our Korean Crew and the crew from "The Big One", the Cuban Missile Crisis and a few more crises of that era. Ralph served in WWII, Korea and the Cold War Navy. He was a short guy that we ALL LOOKED UP TO! We will miss you Chief.

MINI WORK PARTY RECAP MARCH, 2015

This work party was probably the most expensive one we have ever had. I know this might sound like bad news **BUT**, we are going to receive a donation of \$8,000.00 from the Patriots Point Foundation. This will cover a lot of our costs.

It started with us staying at the Red Roof Inn for a week. Four rooms for eight guys cost about \$1,900. We have been staying on the Yorktown for a few years now and that was when they had availability for us. We are working so hard to get our ship in compliance with the new rules that have been put in place since she was away for 3 years.

There were eight of us at the work party: Sonny Walker, John Hudak, Dave Harhager, Ken Rohloff, Rich McKinney, Joe Luque, Ed and Bill Fitzsimmons. Those guys busted their butts trying to finish before the end of the week. It ended up that we were a day or two short of our goals. The plumber didn't get to make the connection to the existing system on the pier and we need a day or two to complete the work on the plumbing and the cleaning up the compartments and the heads.

Hudak, Bill Fitzsimmons, Ed Fitzsimmons and Dave Harhager did most of the PVC hook-ups. This was a tough job. But, it really looks good. This took many trips to the hardware store for PVC pipe and connections and hardware. They relocated and installed the new grinder pump and tank in 1st Division.

Ken Rohloff, Joe Luque and Rich McKinney worked in the CPO berthing space most of the time. They pulled out all of the old mattresses (cloth) and put them in the dumpster because they are considered a fire hazard. We have purchased 14 new fire resistant mattresses to replace them. (\$896.00).

They reattached the racks to the support stanchions in lieu of bunk chains. This will give us a better sleep. When they had room enough, they moved into 1st Division and started hanging the bunks in there.

Richard and Ken completed the welding of the new valve installed in the main deck for discharge to the sewage system on the pier.

We had a very successful work party and are looking forward to returning in April to get everything finished.

WORK PARTY RECAP April 11-19, 2015 We had a very good work party and memorial service for the heroes that gave their lives on 16 April 45 in the battle for the ship at Okinawa.

Patriots Point put on a very nice program aboard the Yorktown (due to rainy weather) that honored 2 crewmembers from the USS Maynard Abele. She was sunk on picket duty by a Baca Bomb (A suicide pilot guided rocket). She went down in 3 minutes. The memorial program was originally scheduled to be held on Laffey's fantail but rain was threatening and so it was moved to the fantail of the Yorktown as a result.

Marines from the land battle were present as well as pilots from the air war. We, too, had a surprise veteran of our own present. Arnold Goldberger was a member of the FIDO team aboard the Laffey. He boarded the ship at Ulithi just in time to go to Radar Picket Station One. We were all seated in the front row.

The guest speaker was Rep. James Smith, grandson of Lt. Paul Smith, assistant gunnery officer on Laffey during the battle. James made a fine speech and told of all of the exploits of the veterans present and of the Laffey. We were all very proud. When it became my turn to speak I apologized to the crowd as I felt unworthy to sit in the same row as those heroes.

I have to send out a special thank you to Mary and Ray Broll for donating a slow cooker that we can use to cook some good dinners. I have had it at my house for a long time and now we can finally get ready to stay on board and enjoy home-cooked meals! Thanks again Mary and Ray.

Steve Papp and John (too much milk) Kapuska delivered a check for \$500.00 from the Catholic War Vets of Derby, CT. We used it to buy food for the group for the entire week.

A lot of our work this time was very amusing! A crew worked on MT 51 led by Richard McKinney and our new VP Chris Kirhagis. They started out with a buckle in the plate on the roof of the mount around the edges. They were working on the top and dropped a chisel down inside the gun mount. That resulted in our having to take the doors of the

mount off to search for the chisel. The good news is that the chisel was found. The bad news is, we lost a whole day's work. We had a lot of laughs about it. I told Richard that we were trying to do a "Yard Job while we were at sea". It turned out that we had to leave the big job until this fall with the large work party. Poor Richard really caught a lot of teasing about that. Little Mike Pereira painted the doors and got it looking respectable before we left.

Homer Doster and John Miller took on the job of finishing the ship's office. They found an old desk "somewhere" and decided to paint it. When we walked by, Homer was holding the brush on the desk and Miller was moving the desk back and forth. It was a very strange way to paint but it looked good!! You'll have to ask them about it when you see them. They also cleaned the Laundry and Sick Bay too. While cleaning sick bay they also conducted some medical experiments. You will have to ask them about that too.

Homer discovered at the end of the job that he had left his hat sitting at the back of the room. Of course he couldn't get there due to the wet paint. More laughs and teasing. Tom Phelps found the power source to the ship's office and finally got some lights in there. I guess he was waiting for Knip to stay home so he could "strut his stuff".

Navy's New Maritime Strategy Includes More Destroyers to Pacific

U.S. Navy leaders' plans to forward deploy two more destroyers to Japan and base another attack submarine in Guam appear to be part of a new maritime strategy expected to be released by the Navy next month.

While most of the details of the new strategy for the Navy, Marines and Coast Guard will not yet be discussed by Navy officials, the effort does include a new examination of the sea-services' ability to forward deploy and project power in global hotspots such as the Pacific theater and Middle East.

"The sea services have updated the maritime strategy in response to changes in the global security environment, new strategic guidance and a changed fiscal environment," said Lt. Timothy Hawkins, a Navy spokesman, told Military.com.

The new maritime strategy, called "A Cooperative Strategy for 21st Century Seapower: Forward Engaged Ready," will provide a comprehensive overview and build upon Navy priorities such as the need for deterrence, Hawkins explained.

"The principles of our maritime strategy largely remain the same from 2007. It continues to prioritize and value forward presence while emphasizing the continued need for the primary functions of a maritime service which are – deterrence, power projection, sea-control and maritime security," he said.

While Navy officials did not specify whether the new strategy takes up the issue of the Pentagon's Pacific rebalance, officials told Military.com that the document does address the challenges maritime forces face when it comes to accessing and operating in more "contested" environments.

Regarding the Pacific rebalance, Hawkins did reiterate that the Navy plans to base as much as 60-percent of its fleet in the Pacific region by 2020.

Also, speaking Feb. 26 before the House Appropriations Committee – Defense subcommittee hearing on the Navy budget, Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Jonathan Greenert made reference to the Navy's ongoing push to rebalance the Pacific Fleet.

Greenert said the Navy's force of attack submarines based in Guam will be increased this year. He also made reference to the fact that two additional destroyers will be forward deployed to Japan.

By the end of this year, the number of attack submarines the Navy rotates through Guam will jump from three to four, service officials said. Also, the Navy's aegis-capable a guided missile cruiser, the USS Chancellorsville, will rotate through Japan by the end of 2015, service officials said.

At the moment, the Navy operates one carrier, seven destroyers, four mine-sweeping vessels, two cruisers and six amphibious ships from Japan, Hawkins said.

In addition, the Navy has included the rotation of Littoral Combat Ships through Singapore, the deployment of the P-8 surveillance plane and a rotation of Marines through Australia as portions of the Pacific rebalance.

"We have the USS Fort Worth Littoral Combat Ship on deployment over there out of Singapore. When she completes a 16-month deployment, the next ship that comes over will stay. Then another will join and then two more -- so we will have four Littoral Combat Ships by the end of 2017 in Singapore," Greenert told lawmakers.

The Chief of Naval Operations also detailed plans to base the Navy's carrier-based variant of the Joint Strike Fighter, the F-35C, in the Pacific region.

"Our Joint Strike Fighter will deploy to the Western Pacific by the end of this decade. So you see the trend we are putting all the forces out there, either forward stationed or they will deploy there first," Greenert added.

Naval threat assessments and technology development have also squarely been aimed at preparing the force to operate in the Pacific theater, Greenert explained to lawmakers.

"We have benchmarked anti-air, anti-submarine, electronic attack and cyber all to how they would perform in the Western Pacific against potential adversaries out there," he said.

Greenert also said U.S. relations with allies in the region remained strong, citing Malaysia, Indonesia, Singapore, the Philippines and Vietnam. He also added that new partnership opportunities were emerging with India.



VA TO DEBUT ONE-STOP BENEFIT WEBSITE

Veterans will soon be able to log in to just one Department of Veterans Affairs website to manage their benefits, apply for doctors' appointments, and determine their eligibility for programs. The website will go live around May 20, but will first be open to around 50 veterans to help beta test the new portal.

By the end of the year, all veterans will be able to use Veterans.gov to manage more than 350 benefit programs without having to switch websites, call multiple numbers or file large amounts of redundant paperwork.

Once veterans register, the new website will automatically know their eligibility levels for different programs and will tailor their experience using that information. The website will also notify the veteran of various programs they are eligible for but are not using.

State benefits range from free college and employment resources to free hunting and fishing licenses.
