President's Message



Once again... before you begin to read this newsletter, please grab a cup of Joe or your favorite

adult beverage because we have a lot to tell you about our ship! We had two work parties this Fall that were both very productive; we have another coming up at the end of January, then another in April. Our Association Officers continue to work together diligently towards the common goal of keeping our Association, and our ship, going for many years into the future. Our VP, Jim, is the workhorse at our work parties, with former VP, Mike P, as his right-hand man and our Chief of the Paint Department.

Our Aft Fire/Boiler Room and Aft Engine Room are finally connected! Mike Honsinger, John Hudak, Ernie Doyle, and Harry Stoner had a short-notice Mini-Work party, staying aboard the Laffey 24-30 Sep to accomplish a very important milestone: to open the Aft Engine

many of you know, John has been trail bossing this project for 8+ years now. Having the Aft Fire Room open to the public will add an important piece to our museum since it allows us to tell the entire story of how the ship was propelled and energized. Before the two spaces could be joined with an opening that will allow tourists to walk forward (after viewing the Engine Room) we had to relocate two large 480 volt cables that provide shore power from the pier, relocate an electrical unit (the size of a refrigerator), remove an electrical junction box (the size of a microwave oven), remove/relocate dozens of large cables, and lay down decking for the tourists to walk on. Only then could we cut a doorway through a steel bulkhead and associated steel beams. John, Ernie, and Harry did the heavy lifting and dirty work while Mike tried to stay out of the way gathering tools & parts and coordinating with Patriots Point employees. In early October, Patriots Point

brought in a contractor to abate all of the asbestos issues. The next steps are to paint the room, improve the lighting, add barriers to keep the public safe, and add display items. We have come a long way, but still have aways to go before it will be "done".

Our Fall Work party also accomplished a lot! We had several folks arrive Thursday night to prepare to host the USS Mansfield (DD 728) reunion on Friday. We began repairs on Saturday morning and had seven good workdays with cooperative weather 95% of the time. We were about a dozen strong most of the week, with a couple of extra folks on a few days. As some of you know, for no clear reason, the aft bulkheads, just above the main deck, had morphed into a pinkish-grey over the years. Well, you will be happy to learn that the big accomplishment of the week was "No More Pink Laffey"! Here are the highlights of our week: Cleaned, then painted the port, starboard, and aft bulkheads, the top of gun mount 51 (the most

forward of the three big guns), the deck in front of gun mount 51, the port & starboard handrails, and the fire valves. Worked with museum curators to improve and add historical displays, and signage. Removed memorial tree and adjacent sign. Secured safety netting with nylon cord to stanchion cables on all exterior decks. Cleaned out the paint locker and tool room. Swept and vacuumed various public areas. Performed additional clean up from the Sep23 Work party. Please take a look at our website to see the many work party pictures posted there:

Corrosion, and specifically keeping water out of the interior of the Laffey, is our highest priority mission. As such, our workparties will continue to focus on sealing deck/bulkhead leaks and painting exterior surfaces. Additionally, we are working towards getting the Aft Boiler Room opened up to the public in the next year. We also have plans to refurbish the Gun Director (located just forward of the Signal Bridge), the Aft Crew Head (for viewing purposes only), and the Officers Quarters located between the Wardroom and Gun Mount 52. We could really use some new members at our work parties to help with these big projects, along with chipping away at the long list of miscellaneous ongoing repairs that we have, so please email me if you would like to join us!

The day before we kicked off our 2023 Fall Work party, our Association hosted a reunion for the USS Mansfield Association. See their report on this event at www.USSMansfield.com

Sixteen Mansfield crewmembers arrived at 0830, then, at their request, requested permission to board from Capt. Chip Honsinger. USN (Ret), and were piped aboard the Laffey by Machinist 2nd Class Ken McCullough. This made for a fun and interesting kick-off for the 30+ Mansfield family members. Several of our Fall Workparty crewmembers arrived a day early so they could show the Mansfield folks what we have created on the Laffey so far, the areas of the ship that we occupy, and what we are improving for the public to enjoy in the future. The Mansfield folks funded our lunch together in the crews mess area, which gave both groups a chance to get to know each other better. That afternoon. Chip treated all to a Happy Hour on board. It is your President's vision that this was the first of many such opportunities for our former crewmembers to have fun sharing their many years of hard work preserving the Laffey with the former crewmembers of other Sumner ships. There were 58 Sumner class destroyers built and another 12 were built as destroyer minelayers. The Laffey is the only surviving ship in the U.S. of the 70, and is seemingly the only one in the world (29 of them were sold to other navies). So, hosting reunions for sister ships is a great opportunity to not only share what we have built,

but also to recruit some new support for maintaining and improving the Laffey. We received several significant cash donations from the Mansfield crewmembers.

You may recall that in January 2023 I visited Tin Can Sailors DesRon 3 (See http://www.tincansailorsofgoose creek.org/) for their monthly meeting in Goose Creek, just outside of Charleston, and walked away with a \$1000 donation. I visited DesRon 3 again this September and was again presented with another \$1,000.

Regrettably, our Laffey Memorial Tree has left us. The construction for the new resort at Patriots Point began last year and is expected to continue for another five to ten years. The resort itself will not be owned by the Patriots Point Development Authority (PPDA, the entity that owns the museum complex), but the resort will sit on land leased from the PPDA. All of the landside Patriots Point displays, buildings, and parking lots, as you see them today, will be moved, torn down, or changed. The pier and the Yorktown will remain as is. There is a chance that the Laffey could move to a new position on the pier, but that decision will not be finalized until the Laffey goes to drydock for a short inspection and minor repair trip, which will not take place until at least late 2024 or early 2025. I looked extensively into moving our tree to a new location. The advice from several professional arborists was not to

try to move the tree, particularly knowing that its root ball would have to sit in a box for several years before being replanted. A move attempt would have cost \$3.000 - \$5.000, and was given perhaps a 10% success rate. The tree's survivability potential was hampered by the fact that it had grown at about a thirty degree angle over the years, rather than straight up. We did salvage the trunk of the tree, for a future project of some sort. It is stored in the berthing compartment just forward of the tool room, as is the bronze sign and the galvanized steel sign stand.

After searching for a volunteer webmaster for the last couple of years, and having not been successful at finding one, we have hired a webmaster. Cindy Lee is currently employed as the Executive Director for the Yorktown Association, a position that she has held for a number of years. She often works from her office aboard the Yorktown where she handles the sales from their Association's Ships Store, organizes reunions, and handles all their communication and financial affairs. She has also created, and maintains, the Yorktown Association website. In previous Patriots Point roles. Cindy has worked professionally hands-on the Laffey on a number of historical display projects, to

include the extensive Combat Information Center display that was created a few years ago. Having spent many days aboard our ship, she is very familiar with the Laffey, as well as other naval ships, and is a former Navy wife. She began building our new website a few months ago. carefully moving the many pages of data and photos compiled by Richard Felsinger, Jeff Jacobs, and their predecessors. Cindy kindly gave us an incredibly generous price on building and maintaining our website. It is our goal to transition to the newly formatted website later this Spring.

Current News

Join us at a Work Party!

Typically, we have three work parties aboard ship each year: Fall, Winter, and Spring. They kick off on a Friday and end the following Saturday, eight days later. All work party crewmembers must be USS Laffey Association members and be at least 18 years of age. There are currently 28 male-only bunks on the Laffey. However, we have begun discussions on making accommodations for women to stay aboard either the Laffey or the Yorktown during work parties. If you are an 18+ year old female that would be willing to contribute a week's work if we were able to provide free bunk space on board, please contact Mike Honsinger to provide your input. Bunks, linens, towels, hearty meals, laundry facilities, parking and access to Patriots Point Naval & Maritime Museum are all provided free of charge at work parties. If you fly or take the train in, we will pick you up. We spend a good deal of time repairing corroded areas with new metal and paint. In addition, we fix electrical and plumbing issues, as well as improve and maintain the museum displays aboard the ship. Work parties provide a meaningful experience preserving history, are a great opportunity to see the many ship compartments which are typically closed to the public, and also provide an opportunity to meet visitors to the ship. Often multiple Association family members attend together to create a working vacation.

We have shirts and sweatshirts, which are fluorescent green and have wording to clearly identify you as a work party member. They will be given and sold to work party crewmembers in accordance with this policy: If you do not have four serviceable work party T-shirts, we will issue you one free at each work party, until you do have four serviceable T-shirts. During any work party you may purchase unlimited additional Tshirts for \$10 each, or sweatshirts for \$20 each. We also sell Laffey baseball caps for \$10.

The Comfort Inn & Suites Patriots Point provides deeply discounted rates to our members, not only during work parties, but also year-round. For those who serve at our work parties, your Patriots Point security badge not only allows you free access to Patriots Point year-round, but also gives you free access to nearly 50 tourist activities in the greater Charleston area. The "Reciprocity List" showing these 50 places is posted on our website.

If you have an interest in helping us out during the upcoming Winter or Spring Work parties (26 Jan - 3 Feb and 12 - 20 Apr), please email Mike at President@Laffey.org, preferably at least a week in advance. Jim and I have collected an extensive list of projects that we would all like to see addressed in the coming years. For each project, it is our goal to do our best to anticipate the manpower, tools, supplies, permits and financing required so that when our crews show up, we can put everyone to work and keep you busy while you give of your time, energy, and finances to join us. If you can attend a work party, please do your best to commit to specific dates when you will be aboard to eat, sleep and work, then email those commitments to Mike ideally at least a week prior to the work party. Thank you for all the work so many of you have put in over the years to preserve the USS Laffey for America's citizens.
