


RECENT UPDATE ON CAPTAIN CONGER

PATRIOTS POINT AUDIT TO BE SOON

The long-awaited audit of Patriots Point requested by one of the state's most powerful lawmakers nearly a year ago will soon get under way.

The maritime museum in Mount Pleasant announced Wednesday that representatives from the Legislative Audit Council will meet with Patriots Point Executive Director Mac Burdette within two weeks to try to answer several pointed questions about the indebted agency's direction spelled out last July by Senate President Pro Tem Glenn McConnell.

Patriots Point Development Authority Board Chairman Ray Chandler welcomed the audit. "I am positive that they will find that we are moving forward on many fronts," Chandler said. "We now have a plan to bring the Laffey back to Patriots Point, hopefully by Christmas. We will announce next week with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers the results of a study to determine the feasibility of building a cofferdam around the Yorktown, so that, as we identify funding sources for repairs, we will be in a position to move forward."

He also said the board has authorized a request for proposals for a structural assessment of the agency's centerpiece attraction, the World War II era aircraft carrier Yorktown, to find out, among other things, how much it will cost to repair the mud-anchored attraction and how quickly they need to act

Chandler said Patriots Point is operating with a profit and has several initiatives under way to increase cash flow, including the development of 36 acres near the water-based museum.

"We had a process review meeting today (Wednesday) and their staff will come down in about two weeks," Burdette said. "I don't know how long the audit will take or when they will present their findings. This is a performance audit, not a financial audit."

McConnell raised questions 11 months ago about the direction of Patriots Point, saying the tourist attraction "has drifted into a state of inertia and has become overcome by its disabilities."

The Charleston Republican wanted to know how the naval museum plans to repay a \$9 million state loan to repair the warship Laffey. "We have been given two years to figure that out," Burdette said Wednesday.

McConnell also questioned the agency's business plan for the future, how it plans to generate money to return Laffey to the docks and how it plans to generate revenue to conserve its aging vessels, among other concerns.

"They want to know how well we are being run," Burdette said. "They want to know, do we have a long-term plan for maintenance costs of the ships? Do we have a business model for maximum revenue potential? Are we compliant with state regulations? Are we getting the maximum benefit from our leases?"

Burdette said Patriots Point has undergone at least two audits by the state agency since the Yorktown dropped anchor there in 1975, but one in 1990 was called off because of other pressing matters within the state. "We have a lot of things going in a good direction," Burdette said. "I'm kind of taking it as a report card, and hopefully it will tell us what we can do better."

Once the audit is completed, Patriots Point will be presented a draft report to comment on or dispute its findings. It will then go to the Legislative Audit Council, which will issue a final opinion.

Herschel V. Sellers Jr. Captain of the USS Laffey 1953-55 PORTION OF OBITUARY:

Jr. Herschel V. Sellers Jr., of Lookout Mountain, Ga., a retired naval officer and UTC math professor, died on Tuesday, May 10, 2011. He was 93. He was born in Baxley, Calif., in 1917 and received degrees from the U.S. Naval Academy and Purdue University. Mr. Sellers was awarded the Bronze Star-medal for meritorious service during WW II and his ship the USS Wiley on which he was an executive officer received the Presidential Unit Citation.

After the war his assignments included tours of duty on both the U.S. Navy destroyers the USS Ellyson and the U.S. Laffey as the commanding officer. He displayed a courageous effort to rescue the survivors aboard the listing aircraft carrier USS Yorktown during the Battle of Midway, a turning point of WW II.
