APRIL 2017 WORK PARTY

raditionally our work party coincides with the anniversary of the April 16, 1945 attack, however, due to the fact that April 16th this year happened to fall on Easter Sunday, a decision was made to move it to 22–29 April, 2017.

We had one of the largest April work parties in the past fifteen years I have been attending. A total of thirty-six members were there with plenty of work for all.

My pet project was to clean out the entire focsle locker (except the paint supply locker) and move the tools aft to the HT Shop. This was done by all three Fitzsimmons, Homer, and others. McKinney and Rohloff disassembled, rebuilt and lubricated three dogs on the DASH doors.

Rohloff disassembled and lubricated the ship's vise, numerous trips to the Yorktown for supplies, half a dozen trips to a hardware store, assisted in moving mooring lines from focsle to aft berthing.





Honorary Member Rita Maier

We welcome our newest honorary member, Rita Maier, into the USS Laffey Association. She is shown here visiting with Bill Kelly—former SM3/c, plank owner and Okinawa survivor. Rita's three therapy dogs share in this picture.

Rita's life story to date is an interesting and inspirational one. Her work career started upon graduation from high school and continued until her retirement in 2009. During this period, she worked as a typist, a bookkeeper, and finally as an analyst for the FBI. She provided support for countless agents for 17 years before retiring. Not satisfied with the responsibilities associated with her work, she managed to raise a family of three children and share in the lives of two grandchildren.

Upon retiring, she enlarged her family by adopting a Dachshund (whose name is Frankie) and who was eventually certified as a therapy dog. Since 2011, and on a weekly basis for several hours, Rita and Frankie have been visiting and comforting the occupants of the Claremont Care Center located in Point Pleasant, New Jersey. Many of its residents are veterans of WWII.

Her motivation for working with therapy dogs—and visiting veterans in particular—has its roots in the Cardinal Spellman Servicemen's Center in New York City. Her volunteer work in this organization occurred in the late 1960's and was the result of her concern for the young men involved in the Vietnam War. This desire to assist and support servicemen remained with her in

the years that followed, and manifested itself in her present therapeutic activities at the Claremont Center.

It is interesting to note that according to Rita, initially, Bill was somewhat less than enthusiastic about new visitors and other therapy dogs and their handlers. He liked Frankie right away though, and her interest in our ship and the stories that had to be told, slowly made Bill feel much more comfortable during the visitations.

She speaks highly of our website and the information she has gleaned from it—information she has treasured and has put to good use. Bill especially appreciated reading all the oral histories of shipmates that Rita printed for him. He learned that his feelings, all those years later, closely matched the feelings of many of his shipmates. Another outstanding illustration of this of involves a former plank owner, Karl Lebrecht. Through her efforts, she arranged for a meeting at the Jersey Shore, with Bill Kelly and two of Karl's daughters. The younger members of his family

knew very little of their father's experiences on the Laffey and were extremely happy to learn of anything relative to their father. One of the daughters described the visit as "one of the highlights of my entire life."

Rita continues to show a sincere and deep interest not only in the Laffey and its activities, but equally important, she continues to show compassion and appreciation toward not only veterans, but also to other men and women who—for whatever the reason—are confined to care centers

She has written these words to me: "......I feel a strong connection to your amazing ship and to the countless men who served on the Laffey. I am so honored to know of these fine men and feel a little part of your history. I could never thank you enough for all your service and sacrifice for our great Country. You will always be in my prayers."

The members of the Association in turn, thank you for your voluntary efforts and for your desire to make life a little better for all of us.
