With all of that said, most of the country is starting to open up from this nasty pandemic. I said most, as of this writing, Baltimore City has yet to do so. We all know that places that have yet to do so in my opinion are power playing?

We had a very successful April work party! A lot had been accomplished by so many people. I do not want to steal Vice President Mike Pereira's thunder, so I will let him give you a detail as

to what jobs were performed and who performed them. Mikey will also explain about the two individuals that are new to our Association that have developed a board game about the Laffey.

As some of you may know, I have been corresponding with the CEO of Sherwin-Williams as well as Director of Sales, Marine Division Mike Vollman for over a year in reference to materials needed for the fantail restoration project that we would like to perform during the April 22' work party. I am trying my best to obtain the material gratis, if not at least a deep discount. The material alone costs approximately \$7,000.00.

During our April '21 work party all three Fitzsimmons' as well as two welders prepared the decks of both starboard and port side wings off the bridge. All of them did one hell of a job. We had purchased two five-gallon pails of a rust preventative chemical for this project. Thanks to Jeff Jacobs for smoozing a discount and free shipping of the material to Patriots Point. Dave Coates (Patriots Point Maintenance Supervisor) had some of the aforementioned Sherwin-Williams product to use on the wings. His crew applied

the topcoat as well as the nonskid coat. Let me tell you that it turned out beautiful. So, we were able to get a firsthand look at what the fantail will look like.

Jeff Jacobs, who is a member of the Association and is very fond of us, was also the past President of the Patriots Point Foundation as well as our Liaison with the Foundation. We had a substantial expenditure list at the last work party. We purchased a pressure washer, some replacement tools, i.e., drills, sanders, and much needed welding equipment and material for the Fire Room. The cost for all that we acquired during the work party was paid for 100% by the Patriots Point Foundation. Many thanks to them for their continued support as well as the support they have given us in the past. Jeff, thanks from the entire Association, especially the April '21 work party, for your involvement in securing these funds.

I had an impromptu meeting with Mike Hastings, Executive Director of Patriots Point. The main topic dealt with preparing the fantail for the April '22 work party. I requested that the "decoy" spool be removed as well as the human

shield just forward of it. I cited several reasons in that there was no access to get under the spool to repair the leak going into our tool shed, when visitors come on board they hardly ever go toward the fantail, it would give us more space for ceremonies, etc.

Mr. Hastings was very receptive of the idea, and before the end of the work party, there was a crew grinding off the mounting bolts. Within a week I was sent a photo of the spool gone and stored in the "boneyard".

Before you know it our Reunion will be here. I am hoping that there will be a nice turn out.

I also want to give a special thanks to our Webmaster, Richard Felsinger. Over the past six months Richard has been bombarded with a slew of articles, pictures, etc. from me and I know from other individuals to place these things on the Laffey website and/or the Newsletter. We stripped most of the paint off the decks on the wings outside the bridge and had them repainted with a special long-lasting epoxy. Patriots Point supplied the materials. We put the primer down and then did the nonskid. We also had some welding to do up there. We got some bulkheads painted and some just needed a good power washing. We also power washed Mt 51. There was a lot of the main deck that needed to be done and we got done as much as we could. We concentrated on the worst sections. There was some rust damage that needed attention, so we had to cut out the old, rusted section and weld a new plate that needed to be bent around a corner and welded on. John and Donny continued to do their thing down in the boiler room. We got ourselves our own pressure washer and that will help us a lot. Our 2 chefs Mark Maresca & Mike Honsinger did a fine job with the meals and more.

I would like to thank Mark Maresca, one of our chefs, for the wonderful donation of new induction burners and the pans to be used to cook with them. Real quality stuff. I went and donated a nice, new digital crook pot with timer to go along with the other ones we have, so our galley is well equipped.

We took on 2 ex-Laffey crew members that served on the Laffey. Steve Doyle and Dave Stoner. They fit right in and did some fine work. Thank you all that came. You all get a Bravo Zulu.

Served on board USS Laffey (DD724) 2/44 - 6/45 Passed away on April 16, 2004

Jean Smith age 103 widow of Lt Paul B. Smith sent a beautiful letter to Kathy Pereira Membership Chairperson. Lt Paul B. Smith was the Gunnery Officer during WWII. She recalls attending the Laffey's commissioning ceremony on 8 February 1944 in Boston, Massachusetts. She recalls her anxiety and fear during the wartime years with their infant son. Lt Smith was awarded the US Navy Silver Star for heroism, bravery and gallantry during WW II especially during the April 16, 1945 Battle of Okinawa. He later became Captain Smith. March 1989 Edition of the Naval Institute Proceedings "Do You Have a Hero" on Captain Paul B. Smith, U.S. Navy (Retired).

The skipper of the Laffey724 in 1945, Captain F. Julian Becton, U.S. Navy (Retired), points to his gunnery officer then a lieutenant, who had trained his gun crews so well that they performed flawlessly throughout an 80-minute attack by 22 kamikazes.

"The five-inch gunners shot down three of the first four planes and combined with other ships to splash the fourth. The 40-mm and the 20-mm gunners shot down the next four planes. The ninth kamikaze struck amidships and fires in the vicinity of the 40-mm gun mounts. Two more planes both packing bombs crashed into and wrecked the after five-inch mounts; two more crashed into the adjacent after deckhouse; and another dropped a bomb on the ship's stern.

Near the end of the action, a plane came in on the starboard beam. Lieutenant Smith, in the gun director above the bridge, noticed his gunners at five-inch mount #52 were aiming too low and cranked in an "up 50 yards" spot to elevate the guns slightly. The next salvo destroyed plane 1,000 yards from the ship. By this quick action Lieutenant Smith averted disaster, and today the Laffey is still float as a museum ship." Frederick Julian Becton"

DASH (Drone Anti-Submarine Helicopter) Controller now installed aboard USS Laffey





DASH Helicopter in USS Laffey Hanger Bay

The DASH was a small drone helicopter built by Gyrodyne Company of America for use as a long-range antisubmarine weapon on ships. It remained in production until 1969. The DASH's control scheme had two controllers: one on the flight deck, and another in the combat information center. The flight-deck controller handled take-off and landing. The controller in the Combat Information Center (CIC) would fly DASH to the target's location and release weapons using semiautomated controls and radar. The CIC controller could not see the aircraft or its altitude and occasionally lost operational control. During the 2019 Reunion in Newport, RI, Chris Kirhagis was able to get this controller for the USS Laffey. Patriots Point staff installed the controller in the DASH Hanger Bay.


In Memory of Robert "Bob" Toleman
