Remembering RD3 Frank Mayeda and the 2012 Memorial Service. Frank was born 1925 (about) and died 2 February 2013. He served aboard USS Laffey 1945 - 1946 as RD3 (Radarman 3rd Class). He joined the ship in Seattle just prior to leaving for the Bikini Atoll A-Bomb Tests. Frank participated in the April 2012 Remembrance Ceremony. V.P. Bob Wampler then read the names of the men killed at Okinawa while Don Watson tolled the bell in their memory. The bugler played TAPS from the Drone Helo Deck as the memorial wreath was cast into the water by Frank Mayeda and Wilburt Gauding. The Honor Guard then fired a rifle salute followed by the Marine Corps Band beautifully playing The Navy Hymn: It was very moving. The celebration came to a close as the band played Anchors Aweigh and The Marines Hymn.

Craig Keith (1947 – 2021) Passed Away January 7, 2021

LT Craig Keith was the Dash Officer aboard USS Laffey 1969 – 1971. The DASH was a Helicopter Drone that carried Anti-Submarine torpedoes. Craig went on several Mediterranean deployments at the height of the Cold War. See various cruise books from the Cold War era



Craig Keith Obituary (Age 73)

Craig Keith of Alexandria, VA died at home on January 7, 2021, surrounded by his family. The cause of death was glioblastoma (aggressive type of cancer that begins within the brain). He was born in Miami, FL to Janice Race Keith and

Jack Joseph Keith, Jr. The family settled in Alexandria in 1947 and moved to Lake Barcroft ten years later.

Although Virginia was home, Craig's father's CIA career took the family to various diplomatic posts including Turkey, Japan, the Philippines and London. Living abroad was formative to Craig's interest in world

history, maps and politics and to his lifelong interest in stamps, coins and flags of the world. He was a 1965 graduate of J.E.B. Stuart High School where he was a National Merit Scholar. He graduated from the University of Virginia in 1969 where he majored in international affairs and was a member of the Jefferson Society. After completing NROTC at UVA, he was awarded a commission in the U.S. Navy. He served as a communications officer on ships in both the Atlantic and Pacific, notably aboard the famed WWII-era destroyer, USS Laffey. He remained deeply committed to the Navy and the Laffey Association for the rest of his life.

Following his military service, he attended the Corcoran School of Art in Washington, DC where from 1972-74 he trained in the then-emerging field of graphic design. In 1984 he established Craig Keith Design in Old Town Alexandria, a small firm specializing in a wide variety of design types. He cultivated a diverse array of clients and was appreciated for his inventive, effective design as well as the exceptional care he gave to every project.

Craig Keith's vast knowledge of Alexandria history was just one of the ways in which his love of the city and its community revealed itself. A friendly, familiar sight on the streets of Old Town, he employed his photographer's skills to capture the city's beauty in all seasons and weathers. He was an inveterate collector of Alexandria ephemera and artifacts. Over the years of his career, he counted Alexandria businesses, nonprofits, schools, and churches among his most meaningful clients. He served as a longtime board member and officer of the Alexandria Library Company. A devoted parishioner of historic Christ Church for over 40 years, he became the parish designer and a member of the Christ Church Foundation. He was the 2020 recipient of the Rector and Wardens Award.

He is survived by his wife of 46 years, Sherley Osgood Keith; two sons, Harrison Wentworth Keith and Robert Clark Keith (Emily), and one grandson, Samuel Brooks Keith, all of Alexandria; brothers, Kirk Hendrick Keith of Radford, VA and Kevin Scott Keith of Berkeley Springs, WV, and many other devoted relatives.

He was predeceased by his father in 2015 and his mother in 2018.

Craig Keith's family and many friends loved him for his warmth, his perfect integrity, and the goodness and optimism that characterized every aspect of his life. Known for his lightning-quick wit and clever wordplay, he could reduce his companions to helpless laughter, but his humor never came at the expense of others. He was kindness itself. He threw himself into his passions: his family, his lifelong friendships, his many collections, his beloved fishing and supper clubs, and the golden weeks he spent with his family every August in Bayside, ME. His keen powers of observation allowed him to see things no one else saw, and his peaceful presence and generous spirit endeared him to all who knew him. Interment of ashes in the churchvard of Christ Church will be private. A memorial service will be held when it is safe to gather. Dear Mr. Walker, I found your address among my husband's emails, and am writing to tell you the sad news of his death on January 7. He was diagnosed with a brain tumor in January of 2020 and although he initially responded to treatment, the tumor was ultimately incurable. Our family adored him, and of course we are devastated. He was the best of men. Craig's obituary was published in yesterday's Washington Post, and I am sending you the link to the online version. It's my hope that you will send it to the members of the Laffey Association. As you'll see from the obituary, we were careful to include Craig's lifelong devotion to the Laffey Association. He was honored to serve in any capacity, whether it was designing the newsletter or buttons for a spring work party. He was deeply loyal to the ship, its history, and the men who had served on it. Even though he is gone, DD-724 is forever enshrined in our family's collective memory.


